It also meets the requirements of CSA Standard Z1210-17 First Aid Training for the Workplace - Curriculum Carlauran rede Oriss Society Stationary in the National American Management for Training Agencies

Specifically in Saskatchewan, legislation requires the following to be listed on the wall certificate:

1. Course Duration: 18-22 hours includes 14-16 hours first aid, and 4-6 hours CPR

- Preparing for Emergencies
- The Role of the First Alder: Legal aspects, prevention of disease transmission, responsibilities of the first aider, coping with a traumatic event, crisis intervention, shaken baby syndrome
- The Emergency Medical Services System: When and how to call EMS, interaction with EMS
- Basic Anatomy and Physiology: Body systems
- Primary and Secondary Assessment: Recovery position, when & how to use
- Emergency Scene Management
- Assessment and Monitoring of Basic Vital Signs
- Respiratory Emergencies: Basic respiratory system, anatomy, management of airways, resuscitation, airway obstruction, conscious and unconscious adults, child, and infant, prevention, recognition & treatment
- Chest Injuries: Pneumothorax, hemothorax, fiail chest, penetrating chest wound
- Respiratory Distress: Asthma, hyperventilation, anaphylactic shock
- Circulatory Emergencies: Basic anatomy of circulatory system, heart attack and stroke, risk factors, signs and symptoms of heart attack and stroke Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (includes barrier devices): Adult, child, and infant including the use of AED.
- Bleeding & Wounds: Control of bleeding, bandaging, severe bleeding, tourniquet, shock, unconsciousness and fainting
- Soft Tissue Injuries & Abdominal Injuries
